

ARIZONA@WORK Infrastructure Funding Agreement

Local Workforce Development Area ARIZONA@WORK-Yuma County

This Infrastructure Funding Agreement (IFA) is effective from **07/01/26 to 06/30/29** and includes required elements described in 20 CFR 678.755 (b) through (f), specifically:

- Identification of an infrastructure and shared services budget that will be periodically reconciled against actual costs incurred and adjusted accordingly to ensure that it reflects a cost allocation methodology that demonstrates how infrastructure costs are charged to each partner in proportion to its use of the one-stop center and relative benefit received, and that complies with 2 CFR part 200 (or any corresponding similar regulation or ruling).
- Identification of all one-stop partners, chief elected officials, and local workforce development board (LWDB) participating in the infrastructure funding arrangement.
- Steps the LWDB, chief elected officials, and one-stop partners used to reach consensus or an assurance that the local area followed the guidance for the State funding process.
- Description of the process to be used among partners to resolve issues during the MOU duration period when consensus cannot be reached.
- Description of the periodic modification and review process to ensure equitable benefit among one-stop partners.

This IFA is developed in accordance with [20 CFR 678.700](#), which describes one-stop infrastructure costs, and [20 CFR 678.760](#), which describes other shared costs.

(Steps taken to reach a consensus.) February 19, 2026 - an email was sent to all partners, including the Yuma County Administrator, informing them that, as part of the annual review process, we are revisiting the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with all One-Stop partners. The email also advised that we would be using the new template provided by the State for this year's update. The updated document was provided to all partners for review, and partners were given until February 26, 2026, to review the document and provide feedback.

March 5, 2026 - An email was sent inviting them to attend the MOU meeting scheduled for Tuesday, March 10 at 2:00pm.

March 10, 2026 - ARIZONA@WORK-Yuma County convened a meeting of the One-Stop Delivery System partners to review the Memorandum of Understanding. During the meeting, partners engaged in discussions regarding MOU services. The IFA document was not presented at this meeting, as the Finance Manager is still in the process of finalizing it. A follow-up meeting has been scheduled to further review and finalize the MOU and IFA.

04/22/2026 - ARIZONA@WORK-Yuma County convened a meeting of the One-Stop Delivery System partners to review Attachment A of the Memorandum of Understanding and review and discussed the IFA. It was noted that the points of contact will be updated in the IFA, after which the document will be submitted to partners for review. On this same day, corrections were completed and submitted to the partners who provided the corrections for their review. DES had until Monday 04/27/2026 to submit feedback.

05/22/2026 - Finance Manager sent an email to DES to obtain copies of page 5 (B4) and Page 6 (B5).

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Steps to Reach Consensus and Resolve Issues

In accordance with [20 CFR 678.755\(d\)](#), the LWDB, chief elected officials, and one-stop partners took the steps described below to reach a consensus on infrastructure funding.

In instances when consensus cannot be reached, the Parties agree to resolve issues through a process described below ([20 CFR 678.755\(e\)](#)).

DISPUTE AND IMPASSE RESOLUTION PROCESS

All parties will actively participate in local IFA negotiations in a good-faith effort to reach an agreement. Any disputes shall first be attempted to be resolved **informally**. Should informal resolution efforts fail, the process for informal resolution, outlined in the Dispute Resolution section of the MOU, must be followed.

If partners in a local area have employed the informal dispute resolution process and have failed to reach consensus on an issue pertaining to the IFA, then an impasse is declared and the State Funding Mechanism (SFM) is triggered.

- ◆ Step 1: Notice of failure to reach consensus to the Governor, Workforce Arizona Council (WAC), and Arizona Department of Education (ADE).

If the parties cannot reach consensus on methods of sufficiently funding a one-stop center's infrastructure costs and the amounts to be contributed by each local partner program, the LOCAL BOARD is required to notify the Governor, the WAC, and the Arizona Department of Education in writing at least 60 days prior to the required date of execution for the MOU (20 CFR 678.725). Notification must be given to the WAC by March 31 of each year the MOU is negotiated.

- ◆ Step 2: State Funding Mechanism.

Once notified, the WAC staff will apply the State funding mechanism, as described in this policy, for the program year impacted by the local area's failure to reach consensus and make a recommendation to the Governor and the Arizona Department of Education, who must administer funding through the State funding mechanism.

- The State funding mechanism applies to the allocation of infrastructure costs only as defined in section IV. A part of this policy.
- The Arizona Department of Education will make the determination of the amount each of the applicable partners must contribute to assist in paying the infrastructure costs of one-stop centers with respect to the funds provided for adult education and literacy activities authorized under title II, and postsecondary career and technical education

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activities authorized under the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act of 2006 (678.730 c.2).

- Title II providers may contribute up to 10% of workforce set-aside funding to support the local workforce system that supports Title II students and co-enrollment.

◆ Step 3: Infrastructure Budget Created.

Based on the materials provided, an infrastructure budget will be created for use in the State funding mechanism based on the following:

- If the infrastructure budget submitted by the LOCAL BOARD **has been agreed** to by all of the partners. The State funding mechanism will use this budget to calculate each partner's contribution; or
- If the infrastructure budget submitted by the LOCAL BOARD **has not been agreed** to by all of the partners, the WAC staff will consult with the LOCAL BOARD to determine the areas of disagreement and solutions proposed by those in disagreement and the reasons supporting the alternative budget. The State funding mechanism will be calculated based on multiple budgets to determine which budget option is most reasonable, supported by documentation of the costs, and is congruent with the requirements of WIOA.

The IFA was established to describes reasonable cost allocation methodology, where infrastructure costs are charged to each partner based on partners' proportionate use of the one-stop center, relative to the benefits received from the use of the one-stop center consistent with Federal Cost Principles in the Uniform Guidance at 2 CFR part 200 and the Department of Labor exceptions at 2 CFR part 2900.

The Parties assure that if they do not reach consensus agreement on methods of sufficiently funding the costs of infrastructure of one-stop centers for a program year, the State funding mechanism is applicable to the local area for that program year ([20 CFR 678.730\[a\]](#)). In the State funding mechanism, the Governor, subject to the limitations in [20 CFR 678.730\(c\)](#), determines one-stop partner contributions after consultation with the chief elected officials, LWDB, and the State WDB.
